

The Ageing & Disability Commission (ADC) received 84 reports related to allegations or concerns of abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability in Southern NSW in 2020*.




Reports about adults with disability most **commonly involved the spouse or partner*** as the subject of allegation.

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people were verbal abuse, failure to meet support needs and financial exploitation`



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability were failure to meet support needs, verbal abuse and physical abuse (hitting, kicking or punching the adult)
