

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 149 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Albury in 2019-2024*.




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved a parent* as the subject of allegation



66% of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) were verbal abuse. failure to meet support needs and psychological abuse'



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) were failure to meet support needs. restricting access to supports or services, hitting or kicking or punching'




