

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 1561 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from the **Hunter** region in 2019-2024*




Reports about adults with disability **most commonly involved a parent*** as the subject of allegation



of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, financial exploitation and failure to meet support needs`



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was verbal abuse, failure to meet support needs, and preventing or restricting access to supports or services`
