

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 217 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from the **Blue Mountains** in 2019-2024*.




Reports about adults with disability **most**commonly involved a parent* as the subject

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, financial exploitation and failure to meet support needs



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was verbal abuse, failure to meet support needs and other psychological abuse




