

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 611 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from **Canterbury-Bankstown** in 2019-2024*.






Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved the adult's parent* as the subject of allegation

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was failure to meet support needs, verbal abuse and financial exploitation`




The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was failure to meet support needs, verbal abuse and hitting or kicking or punching`


