
The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 853 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Central Coast in 2019-2024*.




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved a parent* as the subject of allegation

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was failure to meet support needs, verbal abuse, and financial exploitation`




