

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 301 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Cessnock in 2019-2024*.



Reports about adults with disability **most**commonly involved a parent* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was verbal abuse, failure to meet support needs and financial exploitation`




