

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 87 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from **Eurobodalla** in 2019-2024*.







The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse. failure to meet support needs and financial exploitation`




The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was hitting, kicking or punching, psychological abuse and preventing or restricting access to supports or services`


