

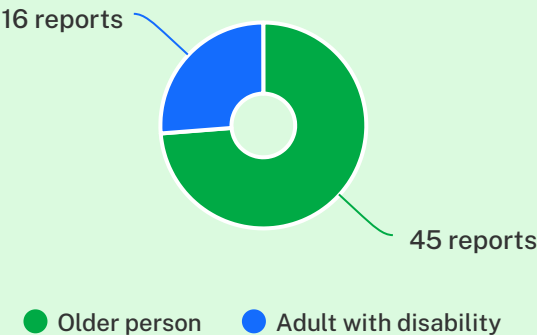
Ageing and Disability Commission Greater Hume Shire



The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 61 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from **Greater Hume Shire** in 2019-2024*.

75% of reports about adults with disability were made by a **paid worker**^



40% of reports about **older people** came from a **paid worker**^

16% of reports came from the **friend of the older person**



11% of reports came from **another relative of the older person**

2 reports were about an adult who identified as **Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander**~



2 reports involved an adult who spoke a language other than English at home with **German** being the most common language reported



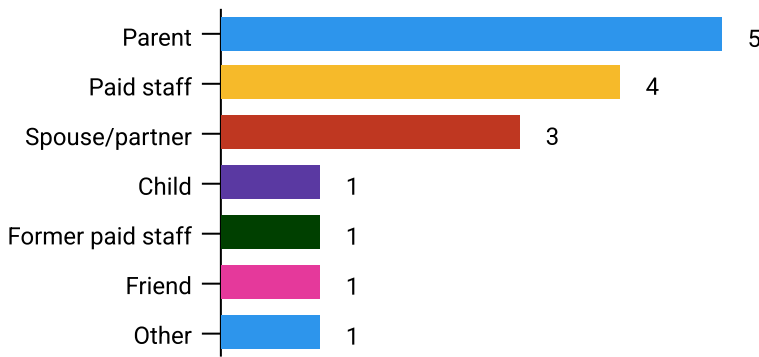

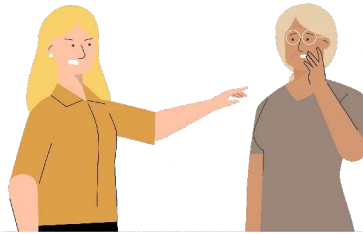

The ADC is currently working on improving our data collection to support reporting on gender identity

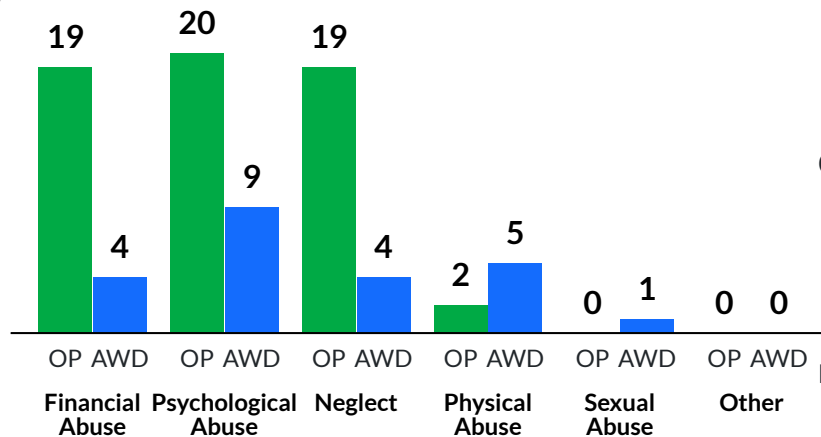
Reports about adults with disability **most commonly involved a parent*** as the subject of allegation



62% of reports about older people involved family members, **mainly adult children** followed by a friend,* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards **older people (OP)** was **failure to meet support needs, financial exploitation and verbal abuse**



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards **adults with disability (AWD)** was **failure to meet support needs, other psychological abuse and preventing or restricting access to supports or services**

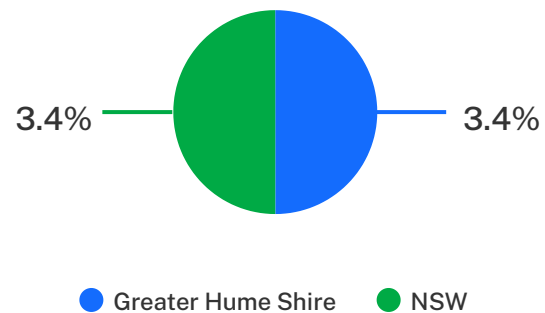

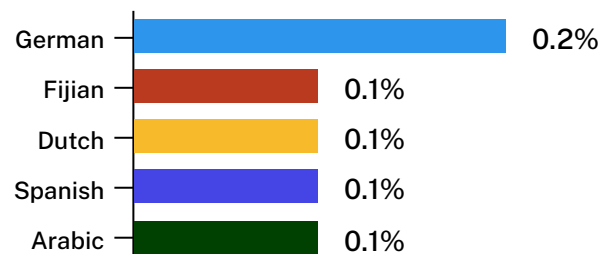
