

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 70 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from **Lismore** in 2019-2024*.






63% of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,* as the subject of allegation




