

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 171 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Maitland in 2019-2024*.

reports involved an adult who spoke a language other than English at home with Italian being the most common language reported




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved a parent* as the subject of allegation

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, financial exploitation and failure to meet support needs`




The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was failure to meet support needs, preventing or restricting access to supports or services and verbal abuse`


