

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 299 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Mid-Coast in 2019-2024*.

of reports about adults with 63% disability were made by a paid



32% of reports about older people came from a paid worker^

22% of reports came from the child of the older person

reports involved an adult who spoke a language other than English at home with Czech being the most common language reported



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was verbal abuse, hitting, kicking or punching and failure to meet support needs`


