

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 587 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from the Murrumbidgee region in 2019-2024\*.




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved a parent\* as the subject of allegation



of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,\* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, financial exploitation and failure to meet support needs`



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was preventing or restricting access to supports or services, verbal abuse and failure to meet support needs`


