

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 265 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from **Penrith** in 2019-2024*.




Reports about adults with disability **most commonly involved a parent*** as the subject

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, financial exploitation and failure to meet support needs`




The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was verbal abuse, hitting, kicking or punching and other psychological abuse`


