
## Ryde



The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 134 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Ryde in 2019-2024\*.




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved paid staff\* as the subject of allegation



62% of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,\* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, preventing or restricting access to family or others and misuse of **Power of Attorney** or Enduring Power of Attornev`



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was financial exploitation, failure to meet support needs and verbal abuse'




