
## Wingecarribee



The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 97 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Wingecarribee in 2019-2024\*.




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved other\* as the subject of allegation



of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,\* as the subject of allegation

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) were preventing or restricting access to services or supports, medical care and financial exploitation`




