

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 518 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from Wollongong in 2019-2024*.




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved a parent* as the subject of allegation

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, financial exploitation and preventing or restricting access to family or others`



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was failure to meet support needs, verbal abuse and preventing or restricting access to supports or services`


