

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 837 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from the Northern NSW region in 2019-2024\*.




Reports about adults with disability most commonly involved a parent\* as the subject of allegation 89



59% of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,\* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse. financial exploitation and preventing or restricting access to family or others`



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was failure to meet support needs. verbal abuse and preventing or restricting access to supports or services`


