

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 417 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from the **Southern NSW** region in 2019-2024*.




Reports about adults with disability **most commonly involved a parent*** as the subject
of allegation



of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,* as the subject of allegation

The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was preventing or restricting access to supports or services, failure to meet support needs and verbal abuse`


