

The Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) received 707 reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability from the Western NSW region in 2019-2024*.




Reports about adults with disability **most** commonly involved a parent* as the subject of allegation



of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's spouse or partner,* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards older people (OP) was verbal abuse, financial exploitation` and failure to meet support needs



The most commonly reported types of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) was failure to meet support needs, preventing or restricting access to supports or services and verbal abuse


